If I want to sign up with EBS, how long does it take to get up and running?

There is a \$200 enrollment fee if you want EBS to complete and submit the Medicare Part B application. If you already have a Medicare Part B number, there is a \$75 setup fee. As a Health Mart customer, you will receive a \$75 discount.

What services are included?

EBS will provide education on joining medical networks, provide immunization documentation forms, process and reconcile all claims, work any denials, and monitor outstanding claims. EBS will also provide monthly management reports, electronic claims access and eligibility services at no additional cost.

What vaccines are covered by Medicare Part B?

If you are enrolled as a "Pharmacy," you can bill for flu, pneumonia, Hep B and exposure vaccines. If you are enrolled as a "Mass Immunization" supplier, you are limited to just billing flu and pneumonia vaccines.

Can I bill other vaccines that are not covered by Medicare Part B?

Yes, but you need to be a "Network Provider" with the insurance plans to receive the best benefits. If the payer is an HMO, you MUST be in network. If the payer is a PPO, the patient's benefits are generally better (lower deductibles and co-pays) if you are in the payer's network. Do you need assistance with Network credentialing? EBS bills all medical benefit plans and will provide you instructions on how to begin the process of joining the medical networks.

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
